February Gardening Tips:

- Clean and tune up lawn mower and other power garden equipment. Sharpen mower blades.
- Prune roses, evergreens and summer flowering shrubs that bloom on
 NEW growth. Don't prune a shrub/plant that is less than 2 years old.
- Remove suckers and crossing branches from crape myrtles.
- Start vegetable, annual and herb seeds indoors.
- Febreze kills ants on contact and doesn't leave your house smelling like poison.
- Throw a few Silica packets (those square things in shoe boxes) inside your tool/garden box. They will never rust again. Also add them to a box of nails for the same result.
