November Gardening Tips:

- Feed established bulbs with a balance slow-release fertilizer (9-9-6), bone meal is good for bulbs
- At 50 degrees all house plants outside should be debugged and brought back into the house
- When cleaning out large containers for the winter you can leave the bottom 8 to 12 inches of soil for spring (unless your plants had disease problems.) In spring loosen up the mix left in the bottom of the pot and refill it with fresh mix.
