The following is a must read for each club member. Please contact Aleta Jenkins or Barbara Hollister with any questions.

These are the changes discussed that all agreed would be beneficial to both parties:

- During a Garden Club meeting day, the preschool teachers will park in the new (south) parking lot to allow more parking slots for Garden Club early arrivals. The group suggests that the church staff and any other visitor also consider parking in the new lot on Garden Club days.
- The Preschool will make a portable sign to be placed at the POH drive entrance indicating Preschool entry only and direction of driving between 0915 and 0945 hours. Cones will be placed if needed to emphasize driving direction.
- The Preschool will work with the church to arrange a designated path for the children to walk that would not interfere with any Garden Club activities.

- The Garden Club will not place tables or structures in the carport entrance vestibule. The front (4 door) entrance is available.
- The Garden Club will communicate to attendees to not drive into the POH parking lot or utilize the carport entrance between 0915 and 0945 hours.
- Should a Garden Club attendee need to leave early when the children are being picked up, they will ask a preschool teacher to assist with backing out safely.
- Any person requiring to use the restroom between 9:15 9:45 will coordinate with the teachers for safe access to the side entrance restrooms. The restroom to the right of the stage, behind the storage room may also be utilized.
- Aleta Jenkins will be the Garden Club liaison with the church for communication and coordination.
